
Industry Certification Attainment

III. Evaluation of the Impact of Action Plans on Program Quality

Clinical space availability continues to be a significant concern in Pinellas County. Incremental increases of simulation afford our students the opportunity to participate in "real life" clinical situations with state-of-the-art simulators. It also gives faculty the opportunity to create essential clinical experiences that the student may not get in the hospital.

ATI practice and proctored examinations give our students the opportunity to practice standardized testing before they have to take NCLEX. It also provides additional learning opportunities for them as well as allowing them to identify and improve in areas where they are deficient.

SSH enrollment is defined as the total number of student semester hours in the specified Academic Organization during the selected academic years. The filters for the SSH Enrollment measure are as follows:

- Career Program Plan Subplan Multi: <u>Undergraduate</u>
- College Group Acad Org Subject: Academic Organization
- All other filters: <u>All</u>

Measure #3: *Performance*

The performance graph displays the percent of students successfully completing a course with a grade of A, B, or C (success rate), divided by the total number of students enrolled in courses within the Academic Organization during the selected academic years.

The performance table includes the percent of students successfully completing a course with a grade of A, B, or C (success rate), as well as the percent of students who withdrew, or received a grade of F or WF, within the Academic Organization during the selected academic years.

Measure #5: Graduates

The graduates measure depicts the total number of graduates within specified program plan(s) associated with the Academic Organization, for the selected academic years. The filters for the Graduates measure are as follows:

- Term Desc Multi: <u>2012</u>, <u>2013</u>, <u>2014</u>, <u>2015</u>
- Graduation Degree Plan Subplan Multi: <u>All Applicable Program</u> <u>Plans</u>
- All other filters: <u>All</u>

Measure #6: Internship Enrollment (Course Groups)

The Internship Enrollment measure reports the number of students enrolled in clinical, practicum, or internship courses within the program plan during the selected academic years. The filters for the Internship Enrollment measure are as follows:

- Academic Year Term Desc Multi: <u>2015-16 Fall, Spring,</u> Summer; 2016-17 Fall
- Career Program Plan Subplan Multi: Program Plan

Measure #7: Industry Certification Attainment

The Industry Certification Attainment measure reports the number of students in the program plan that have attained an industry certification or have passed a licensing exam. *Source:* Career Pathways Department Database, and SPC Fact Book.

Measure #8: Total Placement

Total Placement is the percentage of students who have enlisted in the military, are continuing their education, or are employed in their field within the first year of graduation. The source of the information is the FETPIP/Smart Choices.

Measure #9: National, State, and County Trends

Employment trend information is reported by country, state, and county. The source of the information is: Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) http://www.floridajobs.org/labor-market-information/data-center/statistical-programs/employment-projections. Jobs (2014) refers to the average annual job openings due to growth and net replacement; % Change (2014-2022) depicts the percent change in the number of annual job openings during the eight-year period; and Median Earnings refers to the average earnings for the specified job title. [Note: the ninth area, employment trend information, is not charted and cannot be directly impacted by program performance. Trend data by job title(s) will be provided to each program].

Definition of *Concentrator*

Perkins-specific term to determine which students are tracked for performance indicators

Only PSAV, ATD, CCC, and AS degrees One-third of program completed

For-credit programs: A postsecondary student who completes at least onethird of the hours in a college credit career and technical education program that terminates in the award of an industry recognized credential, certificate or degree.

For PSAV programs: A postsecondary student who completes at least onethird of the clock hours in a career and technical education program that terminates in a credential.

Measure #10a: Completion

CTE Concentrators who achieved one of these credentials in previous Reporting Year (summer, fall, spring)

- College credit certificate (in any CTE program)
- College degree (in any CTE program)

Divided by:

Number of CTE Concentrators who Left the College during the reporting year.

- They are only looking at students who did not return as of the end of summer/beginning of fall semester following the previous reporting year.
- A reporting year in Perkins is summer, fall, and spring.

Measure #10b: Non-traditional Completion

Number of CTE concentrators who completed CTE college credit programs identified as non- traditional for their gender.

- College credit certificate (in any CTE program)
- College degree (in any CTE program)

Divided by:

Number of CTE concentrators in those college credit programs identified as non-traditional for their gender.
